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Digital Safety Initiative



The digital world is a mirror of our society, and increasingly we are parallelly leading our daily lives digitally. Just like we encounter a mix of good and bad in the offline world, we find ourselves surrounded by similar situations when we get online, using our smartphones, laptops, desktops and various other devices.

At the Centre for Social Research, the team has been working closely with women, children and youth of the country on issues related to digital safety and online well-being, through the lens of gender, for over a decade now.

Flagship Programs

Children's Online Safety & Well-being



With over a hundred thousand direct and more than a million indirect beneficiaries of our program for Online Safety and Digital Wellbeing, in partnership with Meta India, CSR has been able to positively impact students from every state/city of the country. The team regularly conducts capacity building and knowledge sharing workshops to engage with children from the age group of **5-18 years**, with age-appropriate modules. Among many important concepts covered in our workshops, we discuss the importance of -

- Digital Citizenship
- Gendered impact of (digital) education
- Vulnerable experiences of children (bullying, harassment, trolling, etc.)
- Consent
- · Socio emotional and psychosocial well-being
- Collectively we learn to identify and tackle dangerous situations online
- Combat fake news & misinformation, etc.

Resources are regularly developed and shared with the students, for example our Online Safety Toolkit, covers all important aspects of safety and security and is easily accessible.

YOUTH: Digital Citizenship & Civic Participation for Gender Equality



CSR, through its network, has reached thousands of college and university students under its program Digital Citizenship and Civic Participation for gender equality, in partnership with Twitter India. Our efforts include, mobilizing students, conducting specialized trainings, resource building and dissemination as well as growing and maintaining of a mentorship program. Mentors from various industries are a part of our program, like media, medicine, tech. Some noteworthy names of our mentors panel are Ms. Faye D'Souza, Ms Fatima Khan, Nikhil Taneja, Dr Shalini Rajnish, Pragya Vats etc. Through the training, we seek to empower young women and men in their engagement in the civic dialogue on social media and also influence policy development on issues of gender. - Increase policy makers' understanding of digital safety and citizenship issues.
- Increase effective government engagement on issues of women's digital safety.

Alliance for Cyber Trust and Safety (ACTS)

Introduction

In today's rapidly evolving digital landscape, trust and safety issues are proliferating at an alarming rate. From misinformation and cyberbullying to data breaches and online harassment, these challenges threaten the very fabric of our digital society. In response, various organisations have been working independently to combat these problems and maximise the positive aspects of our digital world. However, there have been limited collaborative efforts that bring together different stakeholders to share insights and combine their strengths in addressing these digital concerns.

The Alliance for Cyber Trust and Safety (ACTS), jointly housed at The Dialogue and Center for Social Research (CSR), aims to bridge this gap. ACTS brings together a diverse range of organisations—from grassroots NGOs and legal aid providers to support groups offering counselling services—to create a unified platform with a shared vision to tackle the unique trust and safety challenges faced in the Global South. ACTS serves as an interface between industry, policymakers, civil society, users, and other important stakeholders, facilitating dialogue and cooperation across these diverse groups to address digital trust and safety challenges comprehensively.

Mission and Vision

We envision a powerful network, with each member specialising in crucial areas such as research, education, and user empowerment, coming together to break the silos and amplify a collective civil society voice on digital trust and safety. Our purpose is to unite diverse voices working in the trust and safety space and combine their expertise and resources to create more effective and far-reaching responses to digital threats by:

- Fostering Collaboration with Civil Society
- Educating and Empowering Users
- Championing Digital Safety and Respect
- Driving Progressive Policy Discourse

Composition of the Alliance:

The Alliance is housed at The Dialogue and the Centre for Social Research (CSR) and is structured as follows:

Advisory Committee: The Advisory Committee serves as ACTS's primary strategic pillar. Comprised of experts from diverse fields, it sets the Alliance's overall strategic direction and ensures alignment with ACTS's mission and vision.

Members: The ACTS member base includes organizations dedicated to gender equality, safety, and digital literacy, among other focus areas. Membership is open to any Indian civil society organization working in the digital trust and safety space.

Working Groups: These groups take a holistic and inclusive approach, addressing critical elements of digital trust and safety.

Friends of the Alliance: ACTS actively invites key industry players to join as Friends of the Alliance. With Match Group already on board, this component is set to gain significant momentum, attracting more industry players to join the coalition.

WEON- Women Engage Online Alliance



Women Engage Online Alliance is a digital safety initiative by CSR, established with the aim of countering hate speech, threats, lies, and harassment in the Digital Space. The community works to make online spaces safer, tolerant and positive.

We break the negative One Conversation at a Time! If you are someone who is tired of being a passive bystander and want to 'do something' about online abuse, join our community of strong, reliable and proactive individuals.

We detect instances of harassment and bullying, and counter them with a flood of positivity and support under the same post. This isn't just about combating negativity; it's about actively sculpting a cyber landscape rooted in kindness and empathy.

We believe our seemingly small actions wield immense power. Together, let's forge a digital realm characterized by respect, inclusivity, and enriching dialogues!

Online abuse not only compromises the right to expression but also jeopardizes representation and participation of certain people and groups. These incidents disproportionately affect women and minorities, threatening their safety and wellbeing in the physical world as well.

To recognize that the consequences of digital abuse are very real and tangible, is the first step. Nuances of psychological trauma are farther down the list when we begin realizing that character assassination not only threatens an individual's employability, social standing and economic resources, but also alienates them from community life.

With WEON, we push for acknowledgement of cybercrime as serious crimes. WEON stands with the survivors of online hate, abuse and harassment.

Collaboration with Law Enforcement



CSR representatives have formed strong collaborations with the officials from the Delhi Police's IFSO-Cyber Crime Unit to strengthen our efforts to promote digital safety. They are greatly appreciative of CSR's efforts to promote widespread awareness of digital safety

for women, youth, and children across India. The team underwent a comprehensive Cyber Security Capacity Building Training by the law enforcement agency in Delhi.

CSR and the team from the cyber safety cell have collaborated to raise awareness about digital safety through various programs such as conducting training sessions with children & youth.

CSR is also engaging in discussions with the cyber cells of Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, to expand its network.

Advocating for Mental Health



CSR believes mental health is just as important as physical health. Our digital safety programs, each have a important facet of mental health support. We offer support in terms of educational trainings as well as counselling. For this we have collaborated with Fortis National Mental Health Program. We have received mental health guidelines from them which can also be accessed on through our free of cost Survivor Assist Kit, which is now live on our website.

It has been drawn with inputs from professionals as well as the survivors themselves, with the aim to acknowledge and overcome the barriers of procedures and policies. The kit in itself is dynamic & evolving and we are open to any relevant inputs from all.

StopNCII.org

To ensure women's safety on social media platforms, CSR has come on board with an extremely important initiative - StopNCII.org, which acts as a preventative tool to combat sharing of non-consensual intimate images online. Stop NCII helps individuals and victims by removing non- consensual intimate images (NCII) from the internet. The safety of every

individual should be a priority while using digital technologies, therefore we at CSR are proud to be associated with this initiative as a global partner.

The team regularly creates user-friendly infographics in multiple languages, to help disseminate information about stopNCII.org's availability as well as its correct usage, and the usage of CSR's Survivor Assist Kit and the government of India's cybercrime portal.. These infographics are shared by email, Whatsapp, and are posted on all our social media platforms.

Our Student Ambassadors actively contribute to the cause of raising awareness by pinning up posters with CSR Survivor Assist kit and STOPNCII.org helpline's information to the notice boards of their colleges.

This module is utilized in conducting specialized trainings for women from the communities we work with.

Education, awareness generation, and capacity building are the three main pillars of the online safety initiative run by CSR. Our *Digital Safety* module for corporates not only empowers them with digital tools to stay safe online but also encourages them to use social media for social good.

Broadcast Awareness Generation

With a focussed plan of Facebook Live, we have been going live twice a day to leverage maximum traffic timings. We are continuously doing Facebook Live workshops in English, Hindi, as well as other regional languages like Kannada, Bengali, Telugu and

Marathi. CSR's Social Surfing page on Facebook platform currently has 3.5 lakh+ young followers. We use the platform to systematically reach out to young followers on the social media platform. Our digital safety experts designed a training plan for connecting with the existing students in our network through LIVE video excerpts from the in-depth workshop on Digital Safety and Online Well Being. We also encourage our strong follower base on social media to attend the comprehensive training on Digital Safety and Online Well-Being and attempt questionnaires to receive e-certificates at the end of every week. The concentrated execution of the plan has enabled us to gauge the young audience response online. For example in December, while in Lucknow, our workshop went live, for three consecutive days, on Amar Ujala's Facebook channel with 207,149 followers.


As part of the Mental Health Awareness Week, the International Conference on Safeguarding Mental Health in Gen AI Era is part of CSR's digital safety initiatives that aims to promote online safety through active discourse between diverse stakeholders.

Gen AI and advancing technology pose complex challenges to online safety, particularly for women and children. The proliferation of deepfakes and AI-driven harassment tools are escalating cyberbullying, online harassment and abuse that directly impact mental health.

Following a model of discourse and knowledge sharing, our expert panelists will bring their context specific knowledge to share with us. The aim of this discourse is to shine light on policy blind spots and provide alternate suggestions, redressal routes and frameworks for personal and legislative use.

Research

Women's Self Expression and Online Safety in Gen Al Era



This research aimed to explore the multifaceted dimensions of online engagement among young Indian women. The study delves into their use of social media and dating applications, examining the intricacies of their online social behavior, self-perception, and expression. Furthermore, it investigates how these women establish agency and set boundaries in digital spaces and interact with both their own and other women's **online imagery.**

The primary objectives of this research are:

- 1. To analyze the patterns and motivations behind the use of social media and dating apps by young Indian women.
- 2. To understand the nuances of their online social behavior and the impact of digital interactions on their daily lives.
- 3. To investigate how young Indian women perceive themselves and express their identities in online environments.
- 4. To examine the methods and strategies employed to establish agency and boundaries in virtual spaces.
- 5. To explore the dynamics of how these women engage with their own and others' online imagery, and the implications of such interactions.

Methodology

To arrive at these findings, we spoke to 1200+ women across Chandigarh and New Delhi and developed a detailed survey with 50 questions, prepared for a sample size of 300 women. We also conducted 3 focus group discussions and interviewed 5 women who are used to being in the limelight in their careers.



Parents, Teachers, Guardian Survey

As the key stakeholder in children's online safety and digital wellbeing we request parents, guardians, teachers and care-givers to fill out a *survey* that forms an important part of our research processes. The purpose of this intervention is to enable awareness generation by identifying areas in need of development in the field of digital safety of children.



Youth Digital Safety

The digital world is a huge part of our lives, and gender inequality is prevalent in the online world as much it does in the real world. Towards making the online platforms safer for young girls & women and inclusive for everyone. We are doing our bit, and encourage youth to do the same.


